

## SURCHARGES of CARLOS 1893-94. 1902

### ISSUE.

Necessary surcharges due to a change in international postal rates; See Luis surcharges 1902.

### SURCHARGES.

The two types continue as for the Luis overprints. Type I, 3mm, Type II 4mm.



### ERRORS

As for the Luis surcharges, these are best viewed as printers waste. Shifts are common, with doubled and inverted overprints less so.



### COLOUR SHADES

Intensity of shades are evident as for the original issue 1898/01.

### REPRINTS.

There were three 1905 reprints. 130/50, 400/20 and 400/25. These are easily confused with the originals and some may well have seen postal use. They are all of Type I, paper enamel-surfaced. The stamps marked \* may be such.

NOTE

Type I and II surcharges exist on 65/10 & 400/50 12.5p, chalk-surfaced, 65/5 & 65/10 11.5p enamel-surfaced, and 400/50 12.5, enamel-surfaced. The 115/100, 115/150 and 400/200, 13.5, chalk-surfaced printing was limited.
